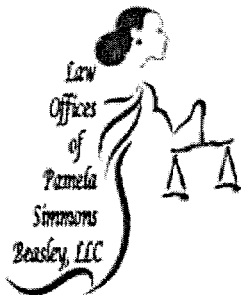

I have been practicing consumer bankruptcy law for 15 years. My clients' cases would benefit greatly from unsecured creditors being required under penalty of sanctions to provide documentation for their claims. Often a statement of the claim is filed with no supporting documentation. In addition, many mortgage creditors wait until the end of the case or after completion of the case to invoice my clients for fees and charges such as late fees when the trustee did not pay timely on their claim; something completely out of the control of my client. Implementation of these amendments and strengthening the amendments will go a long way in making the bankruptcy process more effective for my clients. Thank you for your consideration.
